

UK government appoints SAI Law & Economics for Trans-Pacific and Mexico trade negotiations

As UK seeks to shape the country's post-Brexit trading landscape, SAI Law & Economics, S. C. Like many other countries, Mexico included, UK takes advice from advisors from the country with which it wants to reach an agreement, to better understand the positions of that country's government and the private sector, which helps to bring the positions closer together.
